

Speeding, A Hot Button Issue By Chief Grady Throneberry

Most suburban communities, like Graymoor-Devondale, have "hot button issues"; and for many it is speeding on residential streets. Families are rightfully concerned that children and walkers are at risk from traffic offenders. We regularly hear from residents about speeding on various Graymoor-Devondale streets and we take those concerns seriously.

In order to address those concerns, in addition to individual officers running radar and stopping offenders, we acquired two "smart" radar speed signs; one is trailer mounted and the other is pole mounted. These smart signs have been well-received by our residents; we move them periodically and randomly, and we also move them when residents in particular areas voice concerns about speeding.

Since we believe the signs have been effective, I want to explain why we believe they are effective. Our "smart" signs not only alert drivers about speeding, but they also capture some revealing data. Here are a few items of interest from the information we have collected:

While we certainly have some speeders, most people driving through Graymoor-Devondale tend to obey the speed limit.

Almost everyone, upon seeing the radar sign, taps the brake and slows down, even when they weren't speeding to begin with.

Of the very few drivers who are speeding excessively (15 mph or more over the speed limit), most will slow down to the designated speed limit upon seeing the sign; rarely will a driver just continue at an excessive speed.

We've also conducted some informal, non-scientific tests with a few residents and officers using handheld radar units. The resident will estimate the speed of an approaching vehicle while the officer checks actual speed by radar. Invariably the resident (on foot) will guess the speed much higher than the actual speed. In one particular case our resident insisted that our radar unit was malfunctioning, certain her estimate was accurate.

What does all of this tell us? First, yes we do have some speeders on our streets. We are a convenient cut through for folks trying to save time and avoid lights and traffic congestion, so we are always going to deal with this issue. Second, our new technology (the "smart" radar units) has been helpful in terms of safety information. And third, our speeding problem isn't quite as bad as it may seem, however, the axiom "perception is reality" applies in almost all situations, meaning that we want to hear from you when you are concerned about traffic or any other issue. If traffic is the issue we are happy to place one of the radar signs in any area of interest.
