JOHN VAUGHAN MAYOR'S LETTER.

Update on the pending request for a zoning change on the 1.6 acres at 1701 Herr Lane: Signature Health Care – Jefferson Place. As anticipated the owners of the Berkshire Hathaway-Parks and Weisberg, Realtors have purchased this property and plan to construct a new office building. They are currently in the early stages of requesting a zoning change from the current R4-Single Family to OR-Office Residential. The case is scheduled to be presented to the Metro Louisville Planning Commission at the Old Jail Building, 514 West Liberty Street on Thursday November 21, 2019. This meeting is the regularly scheduled Planning Commission meeting and will start at 1:00 pm and continue until all cases are heard.

Requests for zoning changes are researched by Planning and Design staff. The Commission holds a public hearing and votes to recommend approval or denial to the proper legislative body. Public testimony is taken at this hearing. The Commission limits the time for the presentation of testimony and reading statements on behalf of someone else is not permissible. Authority for final approval or denial rests with the proper legislative body. In this case the legislative body will be the Graymoor Devondale City Council. For more information I encourage residents visit the Planning Commission website https://louisvilleky.gov/government/planning-commission.

Also, on November 19, 2019 from 5:00 pm until 8:00 pm, District 7 Metro Council Member, Paula McCraney will host the Westport Road Corridor meeting in the Westport Middle School Gym. The purpose of this meeting is to discuss plans to improve safety, traffic and access along Westport Road.

While attempts are being made to ensure this newsletter reaches residents before the meetings noted above, in the event the newsletter does not reach households in time, city signs were placed around the city alerting residents to visit the city website for information about public meetings.

As the City is made aware of public meetings related to Graymoor-Devondale, information is posted on the City website http://www.graymoor-devondale.com under the EVENTS tab.

Residents are encouraged to visit the City website http://www.graymoor-devondale.com and register to receive the city newsletter and emails about public meetings regarding our city. Even if residents sign up to receive the newsletter in an email, the city will continue to mail the newsletter to your home address.

In some cases we may use the Reach Alert system to notify residents of the meetings. Residents must register to receive any Reach Alerts. Information on how to register for the Reach Alerts can be found on the Graymoor Devondale website under the NEWS tab.

Many residents have expressed concerns about drainage issues. Graymoor-Devondale is continuing to work with MSD to resolve some of the issues. While some progress has been made it is a very slow process. I encourage any residents that are having drainage issues to report their issue directly to MSD via their Customer Service Online Portal or Email CustomerRelations@LouisvilleMSD.org. Please do not assume someone else or the City of Graymoor-Devondale reported the issue.

While the time-change reduced the daylight time available it has not reduced the enthusiasm of kids, pets and adults that like to play, bike, run and walk through our city during the early evening hours. We encourage everyone to wear reflective clothing, put reflectors on their bikes/helmets, use reflector pet collars and tags. Runners and walkers

should travel facing traffic in areas where there are not sidewalks. It's important that pedestrians see vehicles that are approaching them in the event a driver is distracted. When bicycling, you will want to ride on the right so you are going in the same direction as automobile traffic.

Since the judges will tour the city on December 14th from 7:00 pm until 8:30 pm to select the winners, everyone is encouraged to have their decorations on and in working order for the judges.
