Over the winter months the City Council approved a plan to upgrade the street signs in the city. This project will be completed in phases over the next few years. The first phase will be on Herr Lane north of Westport Road.

City Engineer Mark Madison and Council member John Allen have been busy inspecting all of the city maintained roadways and will present their recommended paving and repair plan to the Council for review at the next Council meeting. Once the plan has been approved this year's work will be scheduled for early summer.

June will be a busy month for the City. We will start off with the City's Garden Tour on Sunday, June 8th from 2:00 PM till 4:00 PM. 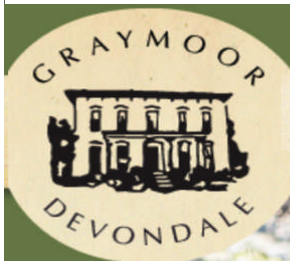
**City Wide Yard Sale

City Council Member, Allyne Adele Anderson
Born May 23,1927 - Died April 16, 2014

It is with great sorrow we share with our residents, the passing of our former City Council Member, Allyne Adele Anderson. Council Member Anderson served as an elected member of the City Council for more than a decade.

Mrs. Anderson lived in our city for approximately 50 years and often shared that when she moved here, the city was farmland. She described the city by saying the "trees were just sticks then, and the landscaping was a planter's dream". She loved how the city evolved while maintaining its charm and, with her husband Jack, raised two daughters.

Her contributions as a Council member were significant. In addition to managing our snow removal contract for a period of time, for eleven years she took great pride in leading the city's beautification efforts. She led the project that transformed the island at Ormsby Lane and Fairmeadows Lane into a signature entrance to Graymoor-Devondale. She spent many hours, every year, decorating the interior of our City Office. Decorating our city's stone walls with bows for the holiday season has become a continued tradition she started.

Council Member Anderson made Graymoor-Devondale a better place for us to live.
