- **Greenlawn/Girard Paving** During the milling and paving it was discovered that the original concrete curbs were built improperly. The city's intention was to recover the existing curb and gutter system. Unfortunately, this caused many residents unexpected trouble when entering/exiting their driveways. At this time these residents have been provided with temporary curb ramps. Milestone Engineering is designing a permanent fix that will be implemented during the 2022 construction season.
- **Herr Lane** Herr Lane is a KYTC maintained roadway. As traffic congestion on Herr Lane continues to grow the city will be working with Metro Council Woman Paula McCraney and our State Representatives to implement improvements as soon as possible.
- Brownsboro Road US 42 KY 22 This project is in the final planning stages and KYTC plans to start construction in the summer of 2022.

Important Election Year Information for Graymoor-Devondale Residents

Residents that moved into our city since the last election are encouraged to check with the Jefferson County Board of Elections to ensure you know where you will go to vote and that you are registered to vote in Graymoor-Devondale.

Residents that are interested in running for the elected position of "Mayor" or "Council Member" are encouraged to attend upcoming City Council meetings. Residents may also contact the city's Mayor or one of your six (6) City Council members to learn more about the responsibilities of these roles.

Mayor's Term: January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2027 (four years)

City Council Member Term: January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2024 (two years)

Additionally, running for an elected position requires timely completion of Jefferson County Board of Elections forms (<u>http://elections.jeffersoncountyclerk.org/candidate-filing-info/ actions.</u>) listed below:

Important Dates for Candidates Primary Election:

Tuesday, May 17, 2022 and General Election: Tuesday, November 8, 2022

• Earliest date for the affixing of signatures on candidate filing forms for an office on the ballot in 2022. Earliest date for candidates to file for an office on the ballot in 2022: Wednesday, November 3, 2021. KRS 118.125(2); KRS 118.165(1); KRS 118.315(2); KRS 83A.045

• Candidate filing deadline: last day to file nomination papers for candidates who must run in Primary: Friday, January 7, 2022, at 4:00 p.m. KRS 118.165(1); KRS 83A.045.

• Public drawing for ballot position: Thursday, January 13, 2022, at 2:00 p.m. KRS 118.225 (2),

• Last day for independent, political organization, and political group candidates to file statement-of-candidacy for the General Election: April 1, 2022 at 4:00 p.m. KRS118.367(1), as amended.

• Last day to register to vote for the Primary Election: Monday, April 18, 2022. KRS 116.045 (2).

• Candidate filing deadline, last day to file any petition, certificate, or statement: Tuesday, June 7, 2022 at 4:00 p.m. KRS 118.365, KRS 118.375, KRS 83A.045.

• Public drawing for ballot position: Thursday, June 9, 2022, at 2:00 p.m. KRS 118.225 (2),(3).

• Last day to register to vote for the General Election: Monday, October 10, 2022. KRS 116.045(2).

• Last day to file a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate: Friday, October 28, 2022 at 4:00 p.m. KRS 117.265 (2).

If you wish to start your campaign before you officially file for ballot access with the Secretary of State or County Clerk, you may file a Letter of Intent with the Registry of Election Finance. KRS 121.170(1).

All local candidates for county and city offices will file their forms at the Jefferson County Clerk's Office, Election Center. Acceptable forms of payment include cash, check, money order, and in person credit card. Please make check payable to Jefferson County Clerk's Office.

Before the election candidates will be given the opportunity to submit an article and a black and white photo of themselves that will be published in the Graymoor-Devondale News newsletter. The candidate's article should include their background, experience, and reasons for seeking an elected position in Graymoor-Devondale.

Speaking of Living in Graymoor-Devondale

This article, while primarily for our city's new residents, it's a reminder to all residents that Graymoor-Devondale has ordinances that help make our city a special community. Here's a few key items that have been brought to the city's attention that are becoming complaints or concerns:

- Trash, Recycle and Yard Waste containers should be placed at the curb after 6:00 PM on the day before the Waste > Management System's pick-up day. Residents are expected to remove these containers from the curb no later than 8:00 AM the day after pick-up and properly store them at the rear of the residence.
- For their safety and the safety of others, dogs and cats are not allowed to roam along our city's streets, or into other > residents' yards. Dog and cat owners should keep their dog(s) or cat(s) on a leash when the pets are not on the owner's property.
- > Walkers are strongly encouraged to wear reflective clothing, carry a light, and walk facing oncoming traffic.
- Bicyclist should wear reflective clothing, have appropriate lighting on their bike and practice bike safety when travel-> ing through our city.
- > The city's traffic signs are for everyone's safety. Please be respectful of walkers, bicyclists, and other drivers by obeying traffic signs.
- > Unfortunately, city officials receive too many complaints about speeders traveling throughout our city. The speed limit in Graymoor-Devondale is 25 mph.
