As a follow up to information provided by our Code Enforcement team, I would like to remind residents that mattresses and upholstered items must be wrapped in plastic for pickup. Waste Management, the city's contracted vendor for sanitation services, will not pickup mattresses or upholstered furniture that is not wrapped.

Also, if you have more recycling than your Recycle bin will hold, you may want to consider purchasing a larger container for your recycling waste. You can obtain a sticker for your container by sending an email to cityclerk@graymoor-devondale.com. We encourage residents to place the sticker on the larger containers for two reasons. First, the sticker indicates the container is for "Recycle" use only. Second, the sticker helps Waste Management quickly identify containers with waste that is to be recycled.

The Westport Middle School Performing Arts program would like to thank the City of Graymoor-Devondale and the City of Lyndon for helping us fund the purchase of equipment to outfit our mini-stage and camera equipment to produce some great videos that will showcase our students' talents!

Westport Middle School is home to 1,300 students and one of the most vibrant performing arts programs in the city, state and the country! The performing arts programs have seen tremendous growth over the last few years. For example, the Orchestra program has been a highlight of the arts programs with the creation of its revolutionary Electric Orchestra, the "Rockin' Warhawks". Since 2015, Westport's ground-breaking electric orchestra – the Rockin' Warhawks, and their electrifying stage presence, has introduced students to a variety of rock, pop, and classical music as an electric orchestra.

Westport Middle School's performing arts programs have exploded with over 400% growth in the last four years. Currently, approximately 600 students participate in the school's arts programs. The Band, Chorus, and Orchestra programs regularly have between 150-200 students respectively in each program. This is very atypical for a middle school art music program as student enrollments in these programs have been declining throughout the country.

Due to the immense success of Westport's music programs, the school recently added Dance and Dramatic performance programs. These new programs gave our students even more opportunities to be a part of the performing arts. Westport Middle school is one of three middle schools in the district to offer such a variety of performing arts programs.
