With spring right around the corner,

It's time to do some spring cleaning!

Performing simple repairs and cosmetic updates around your property helps make our city a happier and safer place to live. Plus, regular maintenance ensures that your property meets city regulations and codes. Not sure where to begin?

Here are some simple guidelines to keep our city cleaner, safer, and more welcoming:

Keep lawns and landscaping attractive and inviting. Develop a reliable lawn and landscaping routine. Mow the grass, trim the bushes and weed

the flower beds often to keep these jobs from becoming overwhelming. Spring is a good time to overhaul overgrown landscaping to create a more welcoming environment for your home - a little bit goes a long way.

- Yard waste must be in containers, paper bags or bundles. Limbs or branches should be tied in manageable bundles no longer than three (3) feet. Yard waste must be placed at the curb the night before your scheduled Waste Management System pick-up day. Yard waste in plastic bags or unbundled items will not be picked up.
- **Trash Containers should be placed at the curb after 6:00 PM on the day before** the Waste Management System's pick-up day. Residents are expected to remove from the curb and properly store trash containers no later than 5:00 PM the day after pick-up.
- **Make sure that building exteriors are clean and maintained.** Repair broken or missing shutters and touch up paint on areas that show chipping or visible wear. Keep front and back doors welcoming and clear of trash. If there are broken outdoor fixtures, repair or replace them.
- **Make sure your house numbers are visible from the street.** In the event of an emergency, you want to make it as easy as possible for fire, police and medical response teams to find your home. House numbers should be a large and located in a place easy for first responders to see from the street.
- Home Improvements often require permits. Visit graymoor-devondale.com for information about fence, driveway or other types of building permits required by our city. You can also contact the City Clerk at (<u>cityclerk@graymoor-devondale.com</u>) or call the City Office at (502) 429-0834 before starting any exterior home improvement project. It is the resident's responsibility to confirm if permits or variances are required from the City of Graymoor-Devondale.
- **Eliminate any sources of visible clutter.** Make sure balconies are not being used as storage spaces, or as drying racks for clothing or rugs. Trash should be contained and out of sight, and parking areas and public spaces should be free of litter, personal belongings, or other debris.
- . Keep outdoor areas clear of pet waste. Please remember, to pick up the waste your pet leaves in your yard. Not only is it a possible health hazard to your pet, on windy hot summer days, pet waste odors may travel to your neighbor's yard. If you walk your pet along our city's streets, be sure to pick up all of your pet's waste. You and your pet should be good neighbors.

Let's work together to provide a clean and safe place live.
