CITY OF GRAYMOOR-DEVONDALE 2023 TREE PLANTING PROGRAM

The Graymoor-Devondale City Council is once again offering the Tree Planting Program to residents, now in its fifth year. This is a first come, first served program for city residents. Due to increased pricing of trees, the city will not plant as many trees as in years past. When the budgeted money is allocated, no further applications will be accepted. The Tree Program's requirements are noted below:

- 1. Residents must request, complete and submit the City's required Tree Planting Program Application by October 18, 2023:
- The application can be obtained by downloading the application (pdf) from the Permits and Licenses section of the city's website at <u>graymoor-devondale.com</u>; emailing Cityclerk@graymoordevondale.com or by visiting the City Office at 1500 Lynn Way during office hours to pick up the application.
- Submission: The application must be submitted by October 18, 2023 by email to <u>Cityclerk@graymoor-devondale.com</u> or delivered/mailed to the City Office at 1500 Lynn Way, Louisville, KY 40222. Applications received after October 18, 2023 will not be accepted.
- 4. Resident may apply for only one tree per lot. The planting location will be in an agreed upon location by the resident and city contractor to ensure tree does not encroach on easements when fully mature.
- 5. Residents will choose their tree species from the city's approved tree list included with the application.
- 6. Graymoor-Devondale will pay the city's contractor directly for trees planted on a resident's lot.
- 7. No upgrades or additional trees will be allowed through this program.
- 8. By signing the application, residents agree to grant the city and its contractor access to plant the tree on their property.
- 9. Residents agree to care for and water the tree for the first year.

10. Trees will be planted late Fall of 2023. The contractor will contact residents prior to planting. The Graymoor-Devondale City Council thanks you for participating in this year's Tree Program!

Where to get Graymoor-Devondale information?

In addition to the city's website, <u>graymoor-devondale.com/</u> the city offers residents two types of outbound communications tools. Both communication tools allow the city to quickly send informational updates to residents that sign up. Instructions on how to sign up for the Graymoor-Devondale App or city newsletter/email tools are in this newsletter and on the city's website.

Residents wanting information about our city's should visit <u>graymoor-devondale.com</u>. This website has detailed information about city services, WM, city government, permits, ordinances and city news. This is the only website for official city business. Should you not find the information you need on the city's website, please send an email to <u>City-</u> <u>clerk@graymoor-devondale.com</u> or call the City Clerk at 502-429-0834.

While there are numerous social media groups on Facebook and Nextdoor some residents may find information, anyone needing specific information about the City of Graymoor-Devondale's services, business and restrictions should visit the city's website, <u>graymoor-devondale.com</u> which is managed by city officials.

Residents that sign-up for the (free) Graymoor-Devondale App on their Smart devices are the first to receive important notifications from the city.

For those not using the Smart devices, you can enroll in the communication tool that allows you to receive the newsletter and emails from Graymoor-Devondale by completing the "Sign-Up for our newsletters and emails" form on <u>gray-</u><u>moor-devondale.com</u>.

Using one of these communication tools, the city can quickly send residents important information. Over the last few months, these communications tools were used to send residents information about WM trash and recycle bin changes and the traffic pattern changes along Westport Road, Herr Lane and Lyndon Lane.

Since printed and mailed newsletters are only sent out a few times each year, residents that decide not to use the Graymoor-Devondale App or the newsletter/email services should visit the "City News" section of <u>graymoor-devondale.com</u>.

Lastly, Graymoor-Devondale does not share or sell any of the information provided by residents that sign up for the Graymoor-Devondale APP or newsletter/email communication services.

Here's the QR code you scan with the camera on your phone or tablet to install the Graymoor-Devondale App. Residents are encouraged to complete their profile when signing up for the Graymoor-Devondale app.

When the city releases information, you will only need to open the Notifications tab in the app.

Traffic Islands Installed in Graymoor-Devondale

New traffic islands on Westport Road, between Herr Lane and Ormsby Lane will change how drivers enter and exit the city's office, Speedway, Taco Bell and other businesses in this area. The islands were installed because of the increasing number of car crashes.

When construction is complete, drivers on Westport Road will be restricted to right turns only to access Lynn Way and Lyndon Lane. Drivers wanting to access Westport Road from Lynn Way or Lyndon Lane will be restricted to right turns only too. Drivers wanting

to make left turns off Westport Road must go to the light at Herr Lane.

As a reminder, the speed limit on our streets is 25 mph and drivers are expected to stop at all stop signs. Everyone's cooperation in adjusting to the new islands and traffic flows is appreciated.

WM (Waste Management)

While the transition to new trash and recycle bins that rely on WM's new mechanical equipment could have been a smoother transition, city officials are hoping residents are adjusting to the new bins and service changes.

Important Service WM Changes

WM's Trash and Recyle bins should be placed at the street with the lid opening facing the street before 4:00 am on the day scheduled for service. Items not inside the WM trash or recycle bin may not be picked up by WM. The lids on bins must close because overflowing bins may not be picked up.

WM recommends placing bins six (6') feet from other WM bins, cars, poles and trees with low canopies that may restrict the truck's mechanical arm from picking up the bin.

Residents with large items should contact WM at 800-607-9509 to schedule a special pick up.

In the event you have trouble with WM's services, it's best to contact WM first. City officials continue to make WM aware of the service issues and will work closely with WM to improve the services they deliver to our residents.

Recycling Guide (Bin with YELLOW lid)

Please DO NOT put any plastic bags in the WM Recycle Bin. The only items listed as "Accepted in Your Bin" on <u>WM.com</u> are the following:

Plastic Bottles & Containers Paper Glass Bottles & Containers Food & Beverage Cans Flattened Cardboard & Paperboard

To ensure products eligible for recycling make it through the recycling process all food waste must be removed prior to putting the product in the Recycle bin. WM has provided a complete list of what's accepted and not accepted as recycling at <u>WM.com</u>.


Yard Waste

Yard waste is scheduled for weekly pick up. When possible, yard waste should be in cans or bags (not plastic). Yard waste to large for cans should be cut into and tied up in three (3') feet manageable bundles. The WM trash and recycle bins should not be used for yard waste.

Mayor's Letter, continued from page 1:

The city will not be doing any major street resurfacing this year. However, minor repairs will be scheduled for Lynn Way, Boxwood Road, Boxwood Court, Girard Drive, Devondale and Devondale Court.

Now a few words on property easements and right of ways. Some residents believe that an easement is not part of their property and that the city, or some other public agency, will maintain the easement. For the most part, easements are a part of the deed and are for the purpose of allowing utilities to access either overhead or underground utilities. It is not advisable for the property owner to build any structures or plant any landscaping in the easement area that would block or hinder access to the utilities. It is the responsibility of the property owner to maintain the easement as they would the rest of their property. The city will fully enforce our property maintenance ordinances in the easement areas.

Right of Ways are areas along side city streets. This area is to allow the city to maintain traffic control signage such as stop, street, and speed limit signs. The other reason for Right of Way areas is to maintain a clear line of sight to the signage and any oncoming traffic at intersections. Any landscaping that is planted in the Right of Way area needs be maintained to allow for that clear line of sight to all signage.

The city, for the fifth year, funded our Tree Program. Residents wanting to add a tree to their property should complete and submit the required application by October 18, 2023. Additional information about the application and program are in this newsletter.

Also, my thanks go out to everyone that celebrated the 4th of July by being a part of our parade. The crowd was great, and many came prepared to win a \$15 Target gift care prize.

Lastly, the Holiday Decorating Contest judging will happen on December 16, 2023, from 7:00 – 8:30 pm.
